<p>Floyd W. West Memorial Scholarship (HS Seniors)</p> <p>Lapeer County Education & Technical Center Seniors pursuing a degree from a vocational, technical, or skilled trades program. Financial need is a consideration. Essay response. GPA \geq 1.75 Award amount: \$500 - \$1000</p>
<p>Hilda M. Hill Memorial Vocational/Technical Scholarship (HS and PHS)</p> <p>Seniors and recent graduates of Capac, Almont, and Imlay City who plan to enroll in vocational, technical, or skilled trades programs. Essay response. GPA \geq 1.50 Students are eligible to receive up to two awards. Financial need is a consideration. Award amount: \$1000 - \$2000</p>
<p>Grant Muir Scholarship (HS Seniors) at ICHS and VENTURE HS</p> <p>Imlay City High School seniors planning to major in Allied Health Sciences. Financial need is a consideration. GPA \geq 2.5. Award amount: \$1000</p>
<p>Robert & Sharon Muir (HS Seniors) at ICHS and VENTURE HS</p> <p>Imlay City High School seniors. Special consideration given to employed students and first-generation college-bound students. Financial need is a consideration. Any major. GPA \geq 2.5. Award amount: \$1000</p>
<p>Glenn L. Smith II Memorial Scholarship (HS Seniors)</p> <p>Imlay City High School Seniors who have participated in Ed-Tech Program for at least one year. Financial need is a consideration. Essay response. Award amount: \$1000</p>
<p>Koerner Family Foundation Scholarship (HS and PHS)</p> <p>Almont, Dryden and Romeo High School seniors and recent graduates who are planning to major in business, engineering, information technology, medical health fields (animal), natural sciences, or vocational/technical training. Students are eligible to receive up to four awards. Essay response. GPA 2.50-3.50. Award amount: up to \$7000.</p>
<p>Murdie Educational Scholarship (HS and PHS)</p> <p>Seniors and recent graduates of Dryden, Almont, and Imlay City who are planning to major in a human-health or animal-health field at a college or university in Michigan. Students are eligible to receive up to four awards. Financial need is a consideration. Essay response. GPA \geq 2.75 Award amount: \$1000 - \$4000</p>

Attention early/middle college, and dual enrollment students: DO NOT apply for Four County Community Foundation scholarships until the year you require tuition payments.

To apply:

After December 1, visit www.4ccf.org/scholarships/apply and set up an account. Complete instructions for using the online platform are available on the scholarship page. If you experience any problems, send an email to mbrown@4ccf.org or call (810) 798-0909.

- **FIRST VISIT:** Click on Register. Select the role of “Student.” Enter your first and last name. Enter a permanent email address and a password. Create User.
- **SUBSEQUENT VISITS:** After the initial registration, you will sign in with your email and password.

NOTE: All communications (including payment requirements) will be sent to the email address that you provide when you register your account. **Use a permanent email address** that you check regularly, not your high school email address. All follow-up documents will be sent to your registered email account.

Essay Response: (Your Story) All 4CCF scholarship applications require students to share their story in a narrative form using complete sentences and paragraphs. Your Story enables review committees to learn more about you. Sharing details about yourself provides the committee with a sense of who you are, how you spend your time, what your circumstances are like, and how Postsecondary Education opportunities support your life goals. Start thinking and writing about the following:

- **Majors:** Some scholarships are only offered when pursuing specific majors. Choose up to 3 majors.
- **Activities and Achievements:** Academic groups, extracurricular clubs, music, athletics. Include leadership roles and awards.
- **Community Involvement:** Ways in which you interact and impact your community. Include community service and volunteerism through scouting, church groups, etc.
- **Special Concerns:** Include any circumstances that present difficulty, such as financial hardship, learning challenges, family challenges, health challenges, obstacles and adversity.
- **Goals and Future Plans:** Include ways a scholarship award will help you achieve your goals.

Other information you’ll need when applying

- **Academic Information:** Your cumulative GPA, an unofficial transcript, your ACT/SAT scores if you took either test
- **Financial Information:** FAFSA Student Aid Index (SAI) report or a document stating why you did not complete a FAFSA form; the number of other scholarships you’ve applied for; the total value of other scholarships you have already received
